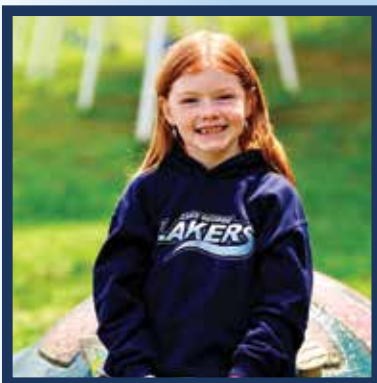

Student Attendance

An excellent attendance record is a top priority in the Lake George Central School District. The District acknowledges that frequent absences and/or tardiness lead to serious gaps in the educational sequence and subsequent understanding for future progress. To participate fully in class and to maximize academic growth, students must be present in school. It is the responsibility of parents/guardians to comply with New York State Education Law, which mandates that children be in attendance every day that school is in session.

The District is committed to active partnership with students and parents in the task of ensuring that all students meet or exceed the New York State Learning Standards. District staff will make every effort to help students achieve positive and productive patterns of attendance. The District recognizes that consistent school attendance, academic success, and school completion have a positive correlation, and therefore has developed, and, if necessary, will revise a Comprehensive Student Attendance Policy to meet the following objectives:

- Increase school completion for all students;
- Raise student achievement and close gaps in student performance;
- Identify attendance patterns in order to design attendance improvement efforts;
- Know the whereabouts of every student for safety and other reasons;
- Verify that individual students are complying with education laws relating to compulsory attendance;
- Determine the District's average daily attendance for state aid purposes.

Description of Strategies to Meet Objectives of Attendance

The District will:

- Create and maintain a positive school-building culture by fostering a positive physical and psychological student-centered learning environment where the presence of strong adult role models encourages

respectful and nurturing interactions between adults and students, where everyone is welcome, important, and valued; where individuals experience acceptance and belonging; where individual and cultural diversity is recognized and celebrated; and where each and every student is guided toward personalized educational opportunities that enable them to thrive and contribute to the betterment of society. This positive school culture is aimed at encouraging a high level of student bonding to the school, which in turn should lead to increased attendance.

- Develop a Comprehensive Student Attendance Policy based upon the recommendations of a multifaceted District Policy Development Team that includes representation from the Board, administrators, teachers, students, parents, and the community. The District will hold at least one public hearing prior to the adoption of this collaboratively developed Comprehensive Student Attendance Policy.
- Maintain accurate record keeping via a Register of Attendance to record attendance, absence, tardiness, or early departure of each student.
- Utilize data analysis systems for tracking individual student attendance and individual and group trends in student attendance problems.
- Develop early intervention strategies to improve school attendance for all students.

Student Code of Conduct

Discipline Philosophy:

Understanding discipline as a “teachable moment” is fundamental to a positive approach to discipline with the ultimate goal of teaching pro-social behavior. Therefore, the board authorizes restorative practices to be employed where appropriate. The use of conflict resolution methods and restitution to those harmed allows for misbehaviors to be addressed with the ultimate goal of teaching pro-social behavior. This approach seeks concurrent accountability and behavioral change.

The main principles of restorative practices are valuing and restoring relationships, repairing the harm done to affected

parties, respecting others' opinions, and reintegrating into the school community.

Under this model, questions that may be utilized:

- What did you think when you realized what had happened?
- What impact has this incident had on you and others?
- What has been the hardest thing for you?
- What do you think needs to happen to make things right?

Essential to the implementation of restorative practices is helping students who have engaged in unacceptable behavior to:

- Understand why the behavior is unacceptable and the harm it causes;
- Understand what could have been done differently in the same situation;
- Take responsibility for their actions;
- Make reparations and or restitution to repair the harm done;
- Be given the opportunity to learn pro-social strategies/ skills to use in the future; and
- Understand that increasingly punitive consequences may be imposed if the behavior reoccurs.

While there may be more traditional punishments in conjunction with teaching behavior expectations and treating disciplinary matters as teachable moments, this is a more effective approach than merely reacting to specific events unless student behaviors pose an immediate or ongoing threat to the safety of other students and staff.

In the application of restorative principles, the process is always voluntary for the students. Any parent (or student over the age of 18) can request to go the traditional disciplinary route and not participate in the restorative process. This may happen at any time during the process, or if a student is unwilling to accept responsibility for their actions and is not demonstrating willingness to make amends.

Our goals in establishing a positive orderly school are to:

1. Establish a climate of equality and mutual respect.
2. Encourage students.
3. Offer students a role in decision-making.
4. Develop students' self-discipline by offering them consistent, logical, fully understandable guidelines for behavior.

Visitor Sign-In

Any visitor to a school building within the Lake George Central School District must sign in with the greeter of that building. Signs are posted on the main entrances of each building directing you to do so. You are to receive a visitor's badge and wear the badge while on the premises. Visitors must comply with the directions of office personnel. Upon completion of your business, you must sign out and return your badge.

School Medication Policy:

If a student is to take any prescription or over-the-counter medication during school hours, parents/guardians must

bring in the medication in the original bottle with both a signed parental consent form and a written order from a physician or other licensed health care provider giving the School Nurses' permission to administer the medication. The medication order must include: the student's name, diagnosis, and the name of the medication, dosage, route, and time to be administered. All medication will be kept locked in the Health Office while on school property. Students are not allowed to keep medication of any kind in their personal property, including book bags, desks, lockers, clothing, etc. The only exception is for inhalers, which may be carried and self-administered by the student with parental consent, a specifically-written Doctor's order, and with the approval of the School Nurse.

Information Regarding the Dispensing of Medication:

- In order to comply with New York State Law, the following procedures must be followed for all students requiring medication during school hours:
- All medications must have a healthcare provider order and written parent/guardian consent in order to be administered or taken at school
- The parent/guardian is responsible to have the medication delivered directly to the school in a properly labeled original container by an adult." (this is directly from NYSED so I think it would be good to copy it)
- Medications not in their original containers will not be accepted. These orders are for both prescribed and over-the-counter medications including Tylenol, Advil, cough/cold medicines, etc.
- Students are NOT permitted to carry any medications (prescribed and/or OTCs) with them during school at any time. Exceptions in special circumstances are students requiring inhalers and/or emergency medications such as an EpiPen.
- A signed, written order from the 1) physician, 2) parent/guardian, and 3) provider for permission for self administration is required in these special cases. Permission to allow these students to carry their medication is at the discretion of the Health Office. If you have any questions, please contact your child's nurse.

Bus Safety Rules and Procedures

The most important element of school bus transportation is the safety of students. In order to achieve a safe and efficient system, drivers must have the cooperation of all student riders.

Annual Notifications

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

Pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, Lake George Central School District hereby notifies parents and guardians that they have the right to:

- Inspect and review a student's educational record
- Seek correction of parts of a student's education record which they believe to be inaccurate, misleading or in

violation of the student's rights. These rights include the right to a hearing to present evidence that the record should be changed if the district decides not to alter it according to the parent's or an eligible student's request

- Report or file a complaint with the Department of Education if the school district violates FERPA
- Exercise a limited control over the student's education records, in a hearing if necessary
- Be informed about FERPA rights

You are further advised: The school district shall limit the disclosure of information contained in the student's education records except:

- by prior written consent of the student's parents or an eligible student,
- directory information or
- under certain circumstances, as permitted by FERPA, state and federal law.

All rights and protections given to parents under FERPA and this policy transfer to the student when the student reaches 18 or enrolls in a post-secondary school.

Student Privacy

Under the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA), parents have the right to inspect and opt their child out of any student survey that reveals information about personal attitudes, behaviors or beliefs. Parents also have the right to receive notice of and opt their child out of any activities that involve the collection, disclosure or use of a student's personal information for marketing purposes and out of any non-emergency, invasive physical exam or screening, except for hearing, vision and scoliosis screenings or as permitted or required by state law.

Dignity for All Students Act

The Dignity for All Students Act (DASA) requires school districts to develop a policy that prohibits harassment, bullying, and discrimination and adds awareness to actual

Pesticide Notification - Your Right to Know

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year. The Lake George Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. If you wish to be placed on this list, please contact the Director of Facilities, Kevin Parrott at 518-668-5452, ext. 1219.

The following applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application
- Antimicrobial products
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- Silica gels and other non-volatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, and gels in areas inaccessible to children
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate

- The application of EPA designated biopesticides
- The application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in container of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets
- In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

Availability of the District Asbestos Management Plan

The Lake George Central School District has submitted information regarding asbestos containing building materials in the school district to the New York State Education Department. This information is documented in the school district's Asbestos Management Plan, which is in compliance with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1987 (40 CFR Part 763). This memorandum is intended to fulfill the annual notification requirements. Under the AHERA Regulation the school district is required to perform re-inspections on all facilities which contain asbestos-containing construction materials once every three years. Documentation related to the re-inspection is available in the Asbestos Management Plan. The AHERA regulations further require that periodic surveillances of the same asbestos containing materials be performed twice a year. These inspections have been, and continue to be, performed and records of the surveillances are also with the Asbestos Management Plan. The Asbestos Management Plan for Lake George Central School is available to the public for review during the following time period.
